

**Report to the SACC Annual General Meeting, Tuesday 21 March 2017**

During the course of 2016 the SACC/SMMC training team have delivered the first comprehensive Scottish Marshals Training Programme, including events run by SMRC, AMRO and SDMC. This has seen a significant contribution of time from the instructors and has resulted in 667 delegate-days of training being delivered by 89 instructor-days of effort. Feedback from delegates has been positive with 61% rating the courses "Excellent" overall, 36% rating them "Good", 2% "Fair" and only one delegate rating the course they attended poor. The programme has delivered a range of rally marshals' training, race marshals training, multi-disciplinary incident handling training, as well as specialist training for medical, rescue and recovery volunteers, including a collaboration with Dundee Medical Students aimed at encouraging more doctors to consider motor sport medicine in the future.

This was delivered at a total cost of £13,375 (excluding the events run by SMRC, AMRO and SDMC), of which £13,113 was provided in grant aid by the British Motor Sports Training Trust.

Detailed feedback from delegates, and discussions with instructors has been key in designing the 2017 training programme. This sees 25 events planned, 23 organised by SACC/SMMC in many cases in partnership with local clubs such as SDMC and EACC. SMRC continue to run their successful race marshals training, and AMRO are planning recovery training during the year. For the 23 events organised by SACC/SMMC we have been successful in being awarded up to £20,500 in grant aid by the British Motor Sports Training Trust, to whom we are most grateful. I am also very grateful to the SACC executive, and the Treasurer in particular for their support in funding the programme.

The season has started with Radio Training in Elgin, Rally marshals training in Inverness, Rescue training near Edinburgh and Incident training at Knockhill. Training days for Race Marshals at Knockhill and Speed Marshals at Alford will run during March. Disappointingly we have had to cancel a proposed speed day at Kames due to lack of delegates. Full details of training days planned, including the modules covered, are available on the SACC website.

Key to the success of the programme is the enthusiasm and involvement of local clubs. It is clear that when clubs are involved in actively promoting days amongst their membership we see significantly higher numbers of delegates registering and attending. To improve the communication with clubs we have been trying to identify Training Champions in each club. The champions will be important in influencing the design of the training programme, planning communications and recruitment of delegates, and in ensuring that we deliver what your club and its members need.
